3. Indianapolis Regional Transportation Improvement Program (Public Hearing)

Mark Myers moved to approve Resolution #22-IMPO-005 **Jason Taylor** seconded the motion. A voice vote was conducted. Resolution #22-IMPO-005 was unanimously approved.

4. 2023 IMPO MEMBERSHIP DUES

Sean Northup gave an overview of upcoming local match dues. **Northup** stated the federal funds used by the MPO require a 20% local match component which is calculated for LPAs by population. Northup stated the total match required is \$630,003. Additionally, **Northup** stated there are two contracts that cannot use federal funds including a Transportation for America membership and legislative work. **Northup** stated these must be funded solely with local match with the combined cost of those contracts being \$65,000. **Northup** then stated the total local match requested including both those contracts would be \$695,003.

Boone County questioned why they had only 391 people listed. **Northup** replied the Boone County area within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) is largely covered by Zionsville but this could change as the new MPA is determined.

STATUS REPORTS

5. FREIGHT PLAN UPDATE

Anna Gremling stated a draft freight network map has been sent out to Technical Committee members and the MPO would like feedback now before it is considered for adoption. Jen Higginbotham introduced herself and said the MPO's freight plan was last updated in 2015. Higginbotham continued by stating the MPO is currently performing a SWOT analysis and working with a strategy committee to continue developing the plan. At this point in the process, needs have been identified based on freight crashes and congestion. Higginbotham stated staff is currently asking for comments on the draft Freight Network Map update. This map is used to prioritize needs, provide information to members, and used for the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) scoring and planning. The map is data-driven and identifies freight clusters, and assigns roadways to freight tiers. Higginbotham asked members to review the freight netowkr to see if some corridors need added or removed or if members have data that is not being reflected. An email went to the technical committee last week asking for comments. This link will stay open through May 9. A public-facing version of the map will be open for public comment between April 25 to May 9. Higginbotham stated a more robust presentation will be presented at the next meeting.

6. Transportation Autonomous Systems Institute (TASI) Presentation

Anna Gremling introduced Clayton Nicholas from the Transportation Autonomous Systems Institute (TASI). Gremling stated the MPO will partner with TASI on an upcoming all-day symposium in August. Nicholas highlighted many tasks being completed by the institute including research, testing of systems to create real-world use scenarios, autonomous vehicle responses to bikes and pedestrians, AI analyzed traffic patterns on highways, vehicle response to medical emergencies, alcohol use, and drowsiness, and predictive models for e-scooters and cyclists. Nicholas stated the institute also works to proactively address ethics in the deployment of the technology in combination with the IUPUI diversity, equity, and inclusion plan as well as sustainability planning. Nicholas then highlighted efforts for Indiana to be competitive in autonomous vehicle deployment in areas such as workforce development, knowledge building, and infrastructure building.

Anna Gremling stated the MPO is undergoing its certification review from FHWA/FTA soon. **Gremling** stated this process occurs once every four years and may require member feedback.
